A Victoria Liberal MLA has sparked controversy for her Facebook message that has caused outrage among British Columbians. Naomi Yamada, a member of the legislature for Cowichan Valley, wrote on her personal Facebook page Sunday that she had been invited to the upcoming wedding of a friend. "Who cares what people think," she wrote. "I will never apologize for wanting to get married in Japan like my husband." Naomi Yamada (Victoria Liberals) The message was posted on Yamada's personal Facebook page, and then was discovered by B.C. New Democrat MLA Mike Farnworth. "This is about as textbook as it comes," said Farnworth. "This is a member of the legislature spreading hate and fear." While Yamada apologized for the offence caused by the message and took down the message, Farnworth said the message had caused an uproar and that she should not have posted the message in the first place. "She should not be sitting there in the house spreading this hatred, and she should not be spreading it on her personal Facebook page," he said. "It's absolutely unacceptable." Liberal House Leader Maryam Monsef said she was deeply disappointed by Yamada's actions. "This is offensive and I completely disagree with it," she said. "I have great respect for the British Columbians who came to Canada with the express intention of practicing their religion. "We are very proud to be a multicultural society and I think it is extremely important to highlight diversity in the community, and that includes highlighting multicultural celebrations in the community."
