Those who meet the new "work-ready test" by June 2012, will be allowed to stay in the UK for two years, but then have to leave. Those who fail the test risk deportation. Critics say the new system will deter people from seeking work. Other groups already

face tougher rules for claiming benefits, including the sick, lone parents and disabled people.
